To create awareness among the sea going fishers on safety measures at sea, a training programme was organized at Uttar Tentulmuri, Murisai, Marishda, PurbaMedinipur on 19th March 2020, with the financial assistance of CIFT. About 37 participants including boat skippers, MatsyaKarmadhakshay- PanchayatSamiti, PanchayatPradhan, Panchayat members and boat owners had actively participated in the programme. The programme was inaugurated by Smt. ArifaBegam, MatsyaKarmadhakshay- PanchayatSamiti, PurbaMedinipur and she talked about various types of hazards faced by the fishermen, subsidy schemes for fishers by Govt. of West Bengal, implementation of biometric identity card to the sea going fishers etc. Shri. Atanu Ray, State Coordinator briefed about the role of CIFT and aim of the programme. He also discussed about Legal documentation for fishing, Safety and security at sea, Importance of registration & license of fishing boat, Safety measures at boat, Protected areas for fishing, Use of different life saving equipments such as life jacket, life buoy, life raft, Distress Alert Transmitter (DAT) machine etc., VHF, HF & MF transmission system, Various day& night light signals while at sea for safe navigation, different communication measures during distress, Rules of the road and weather warning through Power Point Presentation. SCO also highlighted the present issue of COVID-19 and other communicable diseases and how to protect from those diseases and maintain social distancing to stop further spreading of diseases. NETFISH arrangeda hand washing facility with soap and alcohol based sanitizer for all the participants and Shri. Ujjwal Kr. Sar has demonstrated how to wash and sanitize hands. A practical demonstration on use of life jacket, life buoy and DAT were also shown to the trainees. Training kit and certificates were distributed to all the participants.

As part of Joint capacity building programmes for SC fishers under the SCSP component of the ICAR-CIFT, 3 onboard training programmes, 10 Fishing harbour/landing centre/ fishermen village training programme and 3dry fish training programmes were conducted in March 2020. Hygienic handling of fishes onboard and conservation measures onboard were taught to the 20 trainees attend the onboard training programmes. Around 300 beneficiaries attended the fish quality management training programme in the fishing harbour and landing centre. The dry fish trainings included hands on training on hygienic production of dryfish and 90 nos. of SC fisherwomen were benefitted by these trainings.

"One week Skill Development training programme for SC fishers" under SCSP programme of CIFT was conducted at Arakhakuda Village,Puri, Chilka from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> March 2020. The six days long programme started withan inaugural function followed by technical sessions on various topics related to fisheries and exposure visit to seafood processing plant and Jayantipur PFCS. Officials from MPEDA, members of Chilka Development Authority, members of seafood processing unit, SCO, NGO and 30 fishermen had attended theinaugural function. It was

followed by technical sessions on 'sustainable fishery' and 'fish quality management'. An interaction session about the reason for decline of fish resources in ChilkaLake was also conducted during the programme.On the second day, Mrs.Rebeca Jose, Assistant Director, MPEDA took class on preparation of making quality dry fish, raw material selection, processing, cutting, salting and sun drying. She also discussed about the traditional method of fish drying and modern method of fish drying using sun dryer. After that SCO NETFISHtook class on Fishquality management. On the third day, Mr.S.K.Mohanty, Fishery Consultant, Chilka Development Authority discussed about the conservation of fishery resources in Chilka Lake. After the class the trainees were taken to Jayantipur PFCS to see the success of Cooperative Society. Afternoon the trainees visited Hatabaradi fish landing letty also. On the fourthday, the trainees went to M/s.B B Estate Pvt Ltd, Khurdato study and understand different steps in processing unit ie., from raw material receiving, pre-processing, processing (block & IQF), packing and cold storage. On the fifth day State Coordinator discussed about the method and schedule of cleaning of fishing boats and fish landing center. A handson training on onboard cleaning of fishing boat was also conducted during the programme. Then the trainees were taken to Chilka Lake by a fishing boat to see the fishing method practiced in Chilka Lake. Feedback on the training programme was collected and evaluation of the training programme was also conducted on the last day and certificates were distributed to all the participants.

During the month, NETFISH had conducted an awareness programme on Sea Safety & Navigation at Nizampattinam fishing harbour on 6th March 2020. Officials from Marine Police, Department of Coast Guard, Department of Fisheries, members from fishermen association, fishermen societies and around 50 active fishermen were



participated in the programme. Marine Police demonstrated the use of lifesaving equipment such as life buoy, Life jacket etc. to the participants. SCO NETFISH demonstrated the Inmarsat Satellite ISAT2 phone of M/s Elekrtonic Lab (I) Pvt Ltd., Visakhapattinam to the boat owners. He also explained the MPEDA subsidy scheme for By-Catch Reduction Devices, Turtle Excluder Devise and Vessel Monitoring System. The Department officials explained the significance of Distress alert button available in the ISAT phone and also suggested the boat owners to keep adequate number oflifesaving equipments in their fishing boats.

NFDB sponsored onboard programme for popularization of square mesh cod end was conducted at Nizampatnam fishing harbor on 11<sup>th</sup> March 2020. Shri.KannaSrinivasaRao, President, Mogadharamma Mechanized Boat owners Associationinaugurated the function.

During the inaugural function, State Co-ordinator, NETFISH explained the importance and advantages of square mesh cod end to the trainees. The onboard trial was conducted with 2 cod ends ie., 20 mm diamond shaped cod end and 25 mm square mesh cod end. Both these cod ends were covered with a layer of 10 mm sized net to collect the by-catch. After the onboard trial fishermen noticed that due to the less by-catch in 25 mm square mesh cod end segregation of catch was so fast and also noticed that about 2 litres diesel per hour was saved while using 25 mm square mesh cod ends when compared with the 20 mm diamond cod ends. After the onboard trial, the trainees were convinced on the advantages of square mesh cod end. A total of 15 fishermen attended the training programme. NETFISH distributed training kit including notebook, pen and training manual and T-shirt, gum boots and hand gloves to the participants.

On 19th& 20th of the month, NETFISH had conducted 2 Skill development training programme for f'abrication of square mesh cod ends' at Kakinada and Yanam fishing harbours. Shri.Thavudu, a trained trainer was the resource person of the programme and he took hands on training on conversion of diamond mesh to square mesh cod end. Around 60 participants attended the training programme. NETFISH distributed the training manual of square mesh cod end in regional language to all the participants.

NETFISH coordinated with Boat owners and Department of Fisheries for conducting 4 numbers of Skill development training programme on Tuna long line fishing in Andhra Pradesh. The 4 boats which are newly converted from trawling to Hook and line fishing were selected for the training programme. The duration of fishing was between 7 days to 12 days with 2 trainers and 7 trainees in each boat. After the successful completion of fishing, the boat came back with good catch of 2 to 4 tons of fish in which 70-80% were Yellow fin Tuna. The 30-40% of the catch was brought in GG grade as per the trainer's training. Around 28 fishermen are trained onboard and developed the skills of catch of Tuna fish and onboard process for Sashimi grade.

The trainees were first given awareness on importance of use of square mesh codends in trawl nets and Minimum Legal size of fishes. A 25 mm square mesh cod end and a 25mm diamond shaped cod ends were used for the on board trial. A total of 15beneficiaries attended the programme.

NETFISH Kerala South had conducted 2 Skill development training programme on fabrication of 'Square mesh cod ends' at Sakthikulangara and Thoppumapdy Fishing harbourson 5th& 18thMarch 2020. Mr.Dickson and Mr.Ajayan, the trained trainers were the resource persons of the programmes. A total of 59 participantshad actively participated and studied the technique of conversion of diamond mesh net to square mesh cod end.

NETFISH distributed Pamphlet,booklet,pen and writing pad to all the trainees. Certificate was also givento all the participants.



During the month, 2 skill development training programme on Fabrication of square mesh cod end were conducted at Veraval andMangrol fishing harbours on 2<sup>nd</sup>& 11<sup>th</sup> March2020. During the programme SCO NETFISH described about the advantages of square mesh cod end to the trainees. Dr.Prajith K.K, Scientist, CIFT, Veraval was the resource person for the first programme and Mr.Vijay Ganesh and Mr.Karthik, the trained trainers were the resource person for the second programme. The trainees were given with practical class on conversion of diamond shaped net to square mesh cod end. A total of 70 participants attended the training programme.
