MONTHLY REPORT ON ACTIVITIES OF NETFISH DURING OCTOBER 2020

Field level extension training programmes for fishers were initiated during October 2020, and 5 awareness programmes benefitting around 120 stakeholders were conducted as per the details given in the table below. In addition, several meetings and discussions with stakeholders and officials concerned were carried out by direct as well as virtual means to achieve the action plan for the year 2020-21. Also continued disseminating awareness messages among the members of various stakeholder groups through the 129 nos. of WhatsApp groups formed at 98 harbours.

Major activities during the month

- Conducted Paradeep Port Trust sponsored awareness programmes at Balaramgadi & Chilka, Odisha.
- Conducted the Stakeholder's Meeting on 5th October 2020 regarding the 'Training & Certification of fishing vessel Skippers/Sarang/Tindal on Sea safety and Navigation' proposed jointly by CIFNET & MPEDA-NETFISH. Chairman, Director & Joint Director of MPEDA, Director CIFNET, CE NETFISH, Officials from Dept.of Fisheries, Dept. of Port, Coast Guard, Marine Enforcement and Boat owner's association members were present in the meeting.
- As part of the CIFT sponsored programme for SC fishers, fisher aid materials such as Insulated Fish/Ice box (53 Units), Life Buoy (27 Units) and Monofilament Gill net (10 Units-115 Kg) were distributed to the fishers at SC fisherwomen Society, Thottam, Uduppi District. A total of 90 fishers were benefitted by the programme.
- All the NETFISH staff had attended the Online training programme jointly organized by MPEDA & CMFRI on "Marine mammal and sea turtle species identification and by-catch data collection".
- Arranged webinar for Harbour Data Collectors and stakeholders on Covid 19 protocol to the seafood sector.
- Arranged online training programme to Harbour Data Collectors on "Marine mammal and sea turtle species identification and by catch data collection".
- Conducted meeting with stakeholders regarding implementation of SC/ST project at Vaikom, Kottayam District.
- Participated in webinars organized by MPEDA and other organizations on fishery related topics.
- Conducted several meetings with various institutions regarding availability of CSR fund and mail has been sent to around 70 organizations across the country asking CSR fund for

NETFISH extension activities.

- A review meeting with SCOs was held on 19th October 2020 to discuss on the actions taken to achieve the target for the year 2020-21.
- Several virtual meetings and discussions were organized with fisheries officials and stakeholders regarding formation of clusters in fishing harbours, fishing vessel clusters, formation of FPOs, FIPs, harbour issues, status of fishing activities in each region, joint programmes with other organizations, training programme to skipper in fishing vessel, paid training programme to processing workers, methods to reduce post harvest loss, implementation of square mesh cod ends, development of dry fish activities, SC/ST fishermen projects, Turtle and mammal conservation programme etc.
- Disseminated various information and awareness messages on post-harvest loss, conservation, sustainable fishing, PMMSY schemes, MPEDA social media contents, MPEDA Covid 19 guidelines, animated short films on square mesh and juvenile catch, Sea safety & Navigation, fisheries related news published in local newspapers, weather information issued by fisheries department, etc. through WhatsApp to boat owners, stakeholders association and fishermen etc. in the respective fishing harbour and fish landing centre.

On 7th & 8th of the month, SCO had arranged 2 Video conferences with HDCs regarding Covid -19 guidelines in seafood sector prepared by MPEDA. SCO translated the power point presentation of covid 19 guidelines into Bengali language and disseminated through social media like WhatsApp, Facebook as well as through email to all the sea food exporters of West Bengal, Boat owners, fishermen associations, State fisheries officials, officials of BENFISH & WBFCL, faculties of West Bengal University of Animal and Fishery Science (WBUAFSc), Dean of WBUAFSc, Director of CIFRI, Barrackpur, Scientist in charge and other scientists of CIFE, Kolkata, Mumbai, KVK officials, faculty of Fisheries collages, feed manufacturer, aqua farmers, feed dealers, HDCs and WhatsApp groups of Sankarpur Fishing Harbour, Deshapran FH, Kakdwip FH, Freserganj FH, Shoula Landing Centre, Raidighi LC and Namkhana LC. A very good feedback was received from all the recipients and they also circulated among their staff and other contacts.

During the month, SCO West Bengal & SCO Odisha had jointly organized 2 day online training programme on "Marine mammal and sea turtle species identification and by catch data collection" on 27th and 28th of October 2020. During the 2 day training programme SCOs took classes on the topic introduction and purpose of the training programme, responsibility of the HDCs, Import provisions of the USA, Mammals protection act, developing regulatory programs by assessing marine mammal stocks, estimating by-catch, calculating by-catch limits, reducing total by-catch below the by-catch limit, project activities, Marine by-catch data-gaps and issues, Survey methodology, Sampling methods, stranded animal, discarded animals, necessity of collection of information on stranded animals, mode of collection of data on by-catch, Tips to help identification of marine mammals and marine turtles as per guidelines of IOTC, Identification of whales occurring in Indian EEZ, Identification of Dolphins, Porpoise and Dugong in Indian EEZ, Morphology and Identification of marine Turtle, ecological role and importance of marine turtles, Global threats to marine turtles and the important steps to be taken for Turtle conservation in India, Schedule 2,3 and 4 of survey format, etc. After the training programme a detailed review of the programme was conducted and the questions raised by the participants were cleared. SCOs shared all the documents, presentation as well as the survey formats to all the participants.

6. TAMIL NADU SOUTH

In Tamilnadu South region a One day webinar was organized, based on the MPEDA's "Covidsafety protocols in seafood sectorwith special reference Pre-19 to processing centers, Fishing Vessels and Fishing Harbours" in the Tamil language to the sea food processors, fisherfolk etc. Fisheries College & Research Institute (FCRI) Parakkai and M.S. Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF) were the co-organizers of the programme. Dr. P. Velayutham, Dean i/c FCRI, Dr. S. Velvizhi, Principal Scientist MSSRF & Dr. Vinoth S. Ravindran, SCO NETFISH were the conveners of the programme. This programme was conducted on 21st October 2020. A total of 220 participants attended the webinar. The SCO delivered the welcome address. Dr. G. Sugumar, The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of Tamilnadu Dr. J. Jayalalithaa Fisheries University, the Chief Guest of the programme emphasized on the responsibility of the fisherfolk and the stakeholders to adhere with the Government's safety guidelines. He highly appreciated the efforts of MPEDA for issuing meticulous guidelines for the Seafood Industry through the publication of a handbook. He also appreciated the efforts of NETFISH, Tuticorin to jointly organize the programme with FCRI Parakkai and Fish for All Centre of MSSRF for maximum reach among the stakeholders. Dr. P. Velayudham deliberated on the personal precautions to be adopted by processing plant workers with respect to Covid-19. Dr. T. Nirmal of FCRI delivered a lecture on "Transportation and delivery of food ingredients and food Products". P. Velmurugan, Asst. Prof. of FCRI enlightened the participants on Covid-19 preventive measures in aquaculture ponds. Ms. A. Sarojini delivered a lecture on "Steps to be taken for sanitation of seafood processing plant premises in case an employee tests Covid positive". Then there was an interactive session in which the participants actively interacted and recorded their appreciation for the conduct of the webinar in a most relevant topic. They were also cleared their doubts on the spread of Covid in seafood sector. Mrs. N. Chandra, JD, Fisheries of Tamilnadu delivered the special lecture on the 'Effective control of Covid-19 pandemic in the Tuticorin and Tirunelveli districts' and explained about the stringent measures taken by the Fisheries Department by which the financial loss of the fishermen were brought down to a minimum level. State Coordinator NETFISH sensitized the fishermen on the grave consequences of the Covid-19 infections and conveyed the MPEDA guidelines to be followed by fishermen in fishing boats and harbours to combat the spread of the pandemic. Dr. S. Velvizhi focused on the issues of women fisherfolk with respect to Covid and the regulatory measures to be adopted mainly by fisherwomen engaged in dryfish handling. Mr. Thamilalagan of MSSRF did the propagation of Covid-19 precautionary guidelines, including that of MPEDA in the seafood sector, through their "Fishermen Friend Mobile Application (FFMA)". The NETFISH HDCs at different harbours facilitated the fishermen to download the ZOOM app and to attend the webinar. More than 125 fishery stakeholders from Mallipattinam, Colachel, Tharuvaikulam, Tuticorin, Rameshvaram, Mandapam, Chinnamuttom, Thengapattanam and Kottaipattinam harbours have attended the webinar. Various seafood export firms under MPEDA, SRD, Tuticorin have also participated in the webinar. Group meetings for the staff at the supervisor level and above were arranged by M/s Edhayam Frozen Foods Pvt. Ltd., Deva Sea Foods Pvt Ltd and Nila Seafoods Pvt Ltd in their premises and were connected to the webinar. Nearly 55 technicians of the seafood processing plants have participated and were benefitted by the webinar. The participants appreciated the efforts of the organizing institutions and encouraged the conduct of more such webinars to create awareness, especially for stakeholders in the seafood sector. Mr. Daniel, Asst. Prof. FCRI delivered the vote of thanks.
